

# Democrats Spent \$91.5 Million on Same-Party Races in 2016

In 2010 California voters approved Proposition 14, a constitutional amendment requiring candidates in all non-presidential elections to run in a nonpartisan blanket primary. Under this system, the single primary is open to all registered voters with the top two winners facing each other in a run-off in the general election.

Since the 2012 election cycle, there have been a total of 79 same-party races in California for State Senate, State Assembly, and U.S. House of Representatives – 59 races between two Democrats and 20 between two Republicans.

In the 2016 election cycle, Democrats raised or spent \$91.5 million on same-party races – a 69 percent increase from 2014 when Democrats spent \$54.3 million. The average budget for a same-party race between Democrats was \$3.97 million in the 2016 cycle, up 32 percent since 2014.<sup>1</sup>

Republicans raised or spent \$2.78 million on same party races in 2016, a decline of approximately 80 percent since 2014 when Republicans spent \$13.85 million. Notably, there were no same-party races between two Republicans in either the State Senate or the U.S. House of Representatives in 2016.

In total, Democrats have spent a total of \$195 million on same-party races since Prop. 14 first went into effect in 2012 compared to \$31.3 million spent by Republicans. In other words, Democrats have spent \$6.24 on same-party races for every dollar spent or raised by Republicans.

#### Methodology

All data are subject to change as the California Secretary of State, California Fair Political Practices Commission, and Federal Election Commission updates their information. Candidate contribution and expenditure data spans the period from January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2016.

#### State Elections:

Data on contributions and independent expenditures for State Assembly and State Senate candidates were obtained from the California Secretary of State <a href="Power Search">Power Search</a> and cross-checked with campaign finance records on <a href="Cal-Access">Cal-Access</a>.

#### Federal Elections:

Data on contributions for U.S. House of Representatives were obtained from the Federal Election Commission <u>House and Senate Campaign Finance</u> website. Data on independent expenditures were obtained from the Federal Election Commission <u>House Independent Expenditures</u> website.

Contributions and spending for the U.S. Senate race between Democrats Kamala Harris and Loretta Sanchez were not included in this analysis.



# **Appendix 1: 2016 Election**

# California Assembly

In 2016 there were 11 same-party state Assembly races between Democrats. In total, these candidates raised \$49.4 million including independent expenditures, for an average of approximately \$4.5 million per race.

# California Senate

In 2016 there were five same-party state Senate races between Democrats. In total, these candidates raised \$23.3 million including independent expenditures, for an average of approximately \$4.6 million per race.
