

Democrats Spent Over \$90 Million on Same-Party Races in 2016

In 2010 California voters approved Proposition 14, a constitutional amendment requiring candidates in all non-presidential elections to run in a nonpartisan blanket primary. Under this system, the single primary is open to all registered voters with the top two winners facing each other in a run-off in the general election.

Since the 2012 election cycle, there have been a total of 79 same-party races in California for State Senate, State Assembly, and U.S. House of Representatives – 59 races between two Democrats and 20 between two Republicans.

In the 2016 election cycle, Democrats raised or spent a total of \$90.8 million on same-party races – a 67 percent increase from 2014 when Democrats spent \$54.3 million. The average budget for a same-party race between Democrats was \$3.95 million in the 2016 cycle, up 30.7 percent since 2014.¹

Republicans raised or spent \$2.76 million on same party races in 2016. This is a sharp decline (approximately 84 percent) in spending on same-party races since 2014, when Republicans spent \$17.2 million. Notably, there were no same-party races between two Republicans in either the State Senate or the U.S. House of Representatives.

In total, Democrats have spent a total of \$194.2 million on same-party races since Prop. 14 first went into effect in 2012. Republicans have spent \$34.5 million over the same period. Thus, for every dollar spent or raised by Republicans, \$5.64 was raised or spent by Democrats.

Methodology

All data are subject to change as the California Secretary of State, California Fair Political Practices Commission, and Federal Election Commission updates their information. An updated version of this report will be released in February 2017 in order to include final reports filed by candidates and committees.

State Elections:

Data on contributions and independent expenditures for State Assembly and State Senate candidates were obtained from the California Secretary of State "Campaign Finance" website, including "Contributions Received" and "Late Independent Expenditures Affecting this Candidate."

In this report, *contributions* to candidates include all contributions over \$5,000, and contributions under \$5,000 reported by October 22, the most recent filing deadline. The next reporting deadline will cover contributions from October 23 through December 31 and will be included in the next version of this report.

Independent expenditures for state candidates in 2012 and 2014 were cross-checked with data from the California Fair Political Practices Commission. This database has not yet been updated for 2016 candidates, thus totals for independent expenditures may change in the next version of this report.

Federal Elections:

Data on contributions for U.S. House of Representatives were obtained from the Federal Election Commission "<u>House and Senate Campaign Finance</u>" website. Data on independent expenditures were obtained from the Federal Election Commission "<u>House Independent Expenditures</u>" website.

Contributions and spending for the U.S. Senate race between Democrats Kamala Harris and Loretta Sanchez were not included in this analysis.



Appendix 1: 2016 Election

California Assembly

In 2016 there were 11 same-party state Assembly races between Democrats. In total, these candidates raised \$49.6 million including independent expenditures, or about \$4.5 million per candidate.
