

\$231.9 Million Spent on 'Same-Party' Races Following Passage of Prop. 14 in California

In 2010 California voters approved Proposition 14, a constitutional amendment requiring candidates in all non-presidential elections to run in a nonpartisan blanket primary. Under this system, all candidates run in a single primary open to all registered voters, with the top two winners facing each other in a run-off during the general election.

Since Prop 14 was passed, there have been a total of 80 "same-party" races in California for seats in the state Senate, Assembly, and U.S. House of Representatives – 60 races between Democrats and 20 between Republicans.

In total, Democrats have spent a total of \$197.4 million on same-party races since Prop. 14 first went into effect in 2012, compared to \$34.5 million spent by Republicans. Democrats have thus spent \$5.72 on same-party races for every dollar spent or raised by Republicans. Contribution and independent expenditure total for each race are shown in the appendices below.

Additionally, Appendix D provides details on the 21 Prop 14 "winners," i.e. the primary candidates who came in second place behind a member of their own party (i.e. who would have not previously moved on) and who won in the general election.

Methodology

State Elections:

Data on contributions and independent expenditures for State Assembly and State Senate candidates were obtained from the California Secretary of State <u>Power Search</u> and cross-checked with campaign finance records on <u>Cal-Access</u>.

Federal Elections:

Data on contributions for U.S. House of Representatives were obtained from the Federal Election Commission <u>House and Senate Campaign Finance</u> website. Data on independent expenditures were obtained from the Federal Election Commission <u>House Independent</u> <u>Expenditures</u> website.
