

\$135.1 Million Spent in 'Same-Party' Races Following Passage of Prop. 14 in California

In 2010 California voters approved Proposition 14, a constitutional amendment changing all non-Presidential elections to a nonpartisan "top two" blanket primary. Under this system, all candidates run in a single primary open to all registered voters, with the top two winners facing each other in a run-off during the general election.

Since Proposition 14 was passed, there have been a total of 52 "same-party" races in California for the California State Senate, Assembly, and U.S. House of Representatives. In 36 races, a Democrat faced a Democrat in the November election; in 16 races, a Republican faced a Republican.

According to data obtained from the Federal Election Commission, the California Secretary of State, and the California Fair Political Practices Commissioner, Democrats raised or spent a total of \$49.1 million in 2012 races and \$54.3 million in 2014 races, for a total of \$103.4 million. In comparison, Republicans raised or spent \$14.5 million in 2012 races and \$17.3 in 2014 races, for a total of \$31.7 million.

These totals include contributions reported by campaign committees and by Independent Expenditure (IE) committees from both the primary and general elections for the 2011-2012 and 2013-2014 cycles.

For every dollar spent or raised by Republicans in these intra-party contests, \$3.26 was raised or spent by Democrats.

Of these expenditures, IEs raised or spent \$30.9 million in Democrat-vs-Democrat campaigns and \$10.1 million in Republican-vs-Republican campaigns. The balance was raised or spent by campaign committees: \$72.4 million in Democrat-vs-Democrat campaigns and \$21.6 million in Republican-vs-Republican campaigns. This was true across both election cycles and across all three chambers – the California Assembly, Senate, and the U.S. House of Representatives.

This is an update of an earlier study and includes reports not available at the time.
